Suggested Plantings for your Fence:

Size: Minimum of three (3) gallon

Shrubs and Ground Covers:

- *Coco Plum - every 3 feet on center*
- *Buttonwoods - Green (preferred) or silver colors*
- *Viburnum - all varieties use 1/3 of plant line. Suggest evenly spaced every 3 feet on center*
- *Wax Myrtles - These make good buffers*

For Added Color around your fence area:

- *Ixoras "Nora Grant"*
- *Hibiscus – Red colors*

If you would like to plant trees around your fence and they are approved, we suggest planting trees (not citrus) on the corners of the fence. Citrus trees may only be used on the inside of the fence.

Mulch Strip- 12 inches around perimeter of fence. Suggest you use 2" on inside of fence and 10" outside.

(Easy way to install -- kill grass with Round-Up, install fence then install plants and mulch.)
